

BIOGRAPHY JUDITH BARIBEAU

Judith Baribeau first was trained as a contemporary dancer at UQAM and Les Ateliers de danse moderne de Montréal. After founding Echine Do, a dance collective, with four other dancers, and having danced professionally for about two years, she switched gears and began acting.

Fully bilingual, her TV appearances are many: Rumours, Deadly Hope, Thrill Of The Kill, Arctic Blast, The Perfect Teacher and on the French side, Vice cache, 3x rien, Les Invincibles II, 30 vies. And for three years, Judith was Suzanne on the French-Canadian series Trauma.

In 2013, her portrayal of Kim White on Mauvais Karma earned her a Gémeaux nomination for Best Supporting Actress in a Comedy.

More recently, she was Danielle Brassard on the first season of Les jeunes loups. And in the fall of 2015, she will make another appearance as Louise Sirois, on Au secours de Béatrice II.

On the big screen, Judith has worked with Kim Nguyen (Le marais), Philippe Falardeau (Monsieur Lazhar), John Duigan (Head In The Clouds), Alexis Durand-Brault (La petite reine) and she was part of the ensemble cast of Lucidité passagère.

Judith's theater credits include Urbanités, Cracked, The Bed Trick and Je ris... moi non-plus.

February 2016 will see her return to the stage as Virginia, in The Secret Annex, at the Segal Center.

In 2011, Judith had her first taste of the world of screen-writing and production. She co-wrote, co-produced and co-starred in Les 5 and de Félix, a short film that has been shown in film festivals around the world. These days, as a writer and co-writer, she has two features in the works.

In addition to her work on screen, Judith lends her voice to many commercials and video games.
